



## How do we help?

1. **Pray** for those in Haiti and pray for the families who are here in the States. Pray for smooth avenues by which the aid may get to its needed destinations and people.
2. **Pack** Crisis Care Kits. Crisis Care Kits are a tangible way the Church of the Nazarene meets immediate needs of those “on the ground” immediately following a disaster. The instructions for these kits must be followed to a “T”. Crisis Care Kits are 2 or 2 1/2 gallon ZIPLOC bags with the following items:
  - 1 medium-size bottle of shampoo (12 to 18 ounces)
  - 2 bars of soap (bath size or larger)
  - 1 medium toothpaste (4.0 to 6.4 oz)
  - 3 toothbrushes
  - 1 box of Band-Aids (30 or more)
  - 1 fingernail clipper
  - 1 sturdy hair comb
  - 2 hand towels
  - 4 pocket-size packages of facial tissue
  - 1 Beanie Baby –size stuffed toy

We are accepting the above items at the Welcome Center or the church office by Wednesday evening, January 20. We will pack the kits on **Thursday, January 21** at **1:00 PM** in the Fireside Room.

3. **Give** in one of the following ways:
  - A. Give a donation specifically for Crisis Care Kits by making a check to Highland Park Church of the Nazarene and write "Crisis Care Kits" in the memo portion. We will buy the items needed for the kits and assemble them to send.
  - B. Make a donation online through Nazarene Compassionate Ministries at [www.ncm.org](http://www.ncm.org). Checks sent to Nazarene Compassionate Ministries can be marked "**Caribbean Disaster Response ACM1204**" and mailed to Global Treasury Services, PO Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184. We have been advised that funds donated directly to Nazarene Compassionate Ministries will arrive within 48 hours, and that 100% of funds donated to NCM will go straight to the relief fund.
  - C. Make a donation to Highland Park Church and write "Haiti Relief" in the memo portion and we will send the funds to Nazarene Compassionate Ministries.
